CORVETTE TRIVIA ANSWERS

- **1.** 1975 was the last year for a convertible option in a C3 Corvette. The option would later return in 1986, available for that model year, not even by special order.
- **2.** Zora Arkus-Duntov, a GM engineer, earned this title following his many contributions to increasing the Corvette's power and improving its performance.
- **3.** 1970 saw the introduction of the LT-1 package. The high-performance LT-1 motor was complimented by transistorized ignition, a special big-block style hood, 2-1/2 inch exhaust, a higher-revving tach, aluminum intake, Holley carburetor, and more extras. The 454 big block engine option was released this year as well, and also included special extra features. The last years for the LT-1 and 454 options were 1972 and 1974, respectively.
